

Theodore Zeldin has been President of the Oxford Muse Foundation since 2001. Born in 1933, he graduated from London University at the age of 17, and then from Oxford University (with Firsts from both). As an academic at Oxford, he has devoted many years to research on France. As an administrator, he was Dean of St Antony's College, Oxford University's centre for international studies. His interest in the reform of work and management has expressed itself as an Associate Fellow of the Oxford University Said Business School, as a Professor honoris causa of HEC, and as an advisor to corporations and multinationals in many different sectors as well as to governments. He has been a Visiting Professor at Harvard and the University of Southern California, and lectured all over the world. He is a Trustee of an NGO for refugees and another for the medical treatment of the homeless, is co-founder of the Oxford Food Symposium which pioneered the study of gastronomy in universities, and has been a member of the BBC Brains Trust.

His books, which have been translated into 24 languages, include History of French Passions (in 5 volumes), The French, Happiness, An Intimate History of Humanity, Conversation, Guide to an Unknown City and Guide to an Unknown University.
